## WIA Security

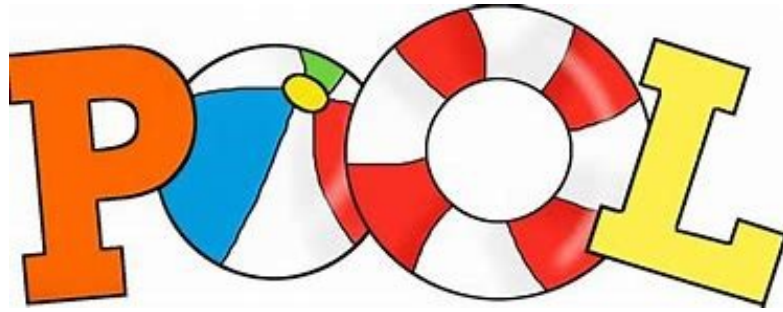

At the last WIA Board meeting, WIA board members discussed the role of our Waterwood Security team and further the role of the San Jacinto County Sheriff's Office. Hopefully none of you will never have to call the Sheriff's Office or Waterwood Security but if you do it is important that you know who to call and when.

This memo has to do with who do you call if you have a serious security situation. For example, if you have heard gunshots, or you are aware of criminal activity, or you are aware of a resident wanting to hurt himself or herself, or you are involved in an automobile accident, or you are aware of domestic issues at a residence your first phone call should be to the **San Jacinto County Sheriff's Office (936-653-4367)**.

Your next phone call should be to **Waterwood Security (936-661-2800)**. You will get a response by calling both numbers and both will be involved in any of the above situations, but the Sheriff's Office is equipped to handle our more serious security situations and as first responders it is their job to be here when we need them.

Waterwood Security will be involved in any of the above issues in a support role and in some cases they will be the first to arrive. If you are in doubt about whether to call the Sheriff's Office or not you can always call Waterwood Security and they can decide for you.

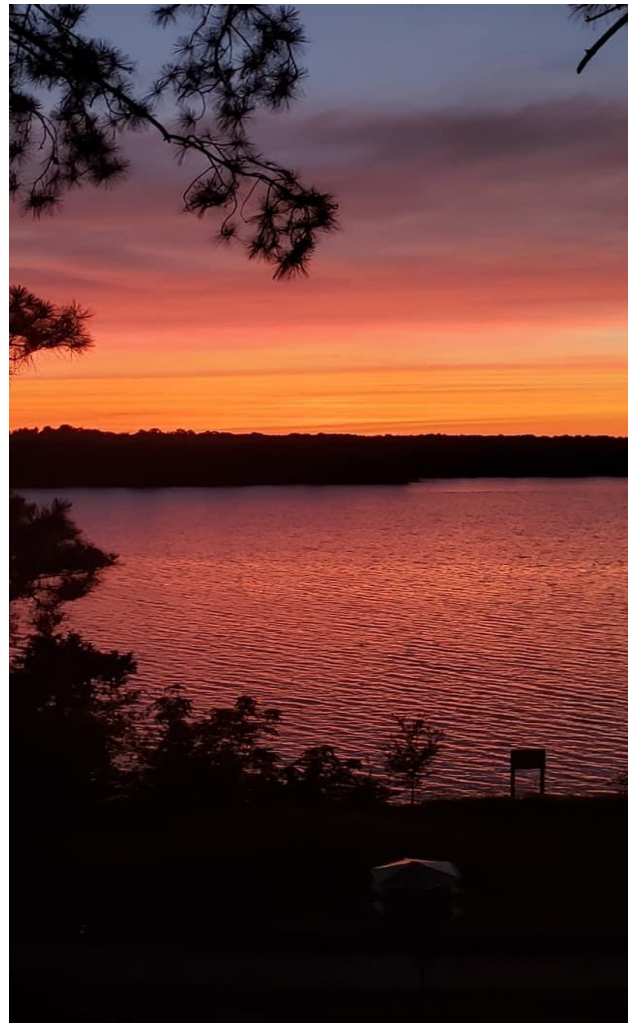
