### Waterwood Women's League Awards Scholarships By Maryann Readal and the WWL Scholarship Committee

The Waterwood Women's League recently awarded scholarships to two deserving students graduating from Coldspring-Oakhurst High School.

The Scholarship Committee, Maryann Readal, Sally Charlton, and Mattie Licciardoni, reviewed 35 scholarship applications from Coldspring-Oakhurst and Onalaska High Schools. The committee interviewed 13 of the applicants for the League's vocational and academic scholarships.

The committee chose Kristopher Baker to receive the one-time \$1,000 vocational scholarship. Kristopher will be attending Hill College to become a welder. Kristopher is also a state champion bull rider and plans to continue bull riding in the future.



The \$8,000 academic scholarship (\$1,000 is given each semester for four years as long as 2.5 grade point average is maintained) was awarded to Tate Stamper. Tate is graduating 8th in his class and will have 70 college credit hours by the time he graduates from Coldspring-Oakhurst High School. He plans to major in biology and wants to teach and be an athletic coach after he graduates. He will be attending Texas State University.

Currently, the League also has two students receiving an academic scholarship. Mattie Adams graduated from Onalaska HS and is a sophomore majoring in Poultry Science at Texas A&M. This summer she is excited about an internship in Colorado working for a company that helps provide food for the world. She also has been named an Aggie Poultry Ambassador. Mattie works two jobs during the school year.

Jaden Griffin graduated from Coldspring-Oakhurst HS. He is a freshman at the Milwaukee School of Engineering. His major is cybersecurity with a minor in mathematics.

Last year, the League awarded a vocational scholarship to Chloe Anstee from Onalaska HS. Chloe is attending Lone Star College to become a radiology technician. This year, Ashley Bell from Onalaska HS, one of our scholarship students, graduated from A&M with an engineering degree and will be working as a mechatronics technician in South Carolina.

The Women's League has awarded its scholarships since 1984 and has given \$150,000 in scholarships since then. Each year the League raises funds for its scholarships by holding a garage sale in the spring and a bingo in the fall. Thank you for your generous support of these events which enable us to continue encouraging our young talent to continue their educations.

#### KEITH'S CORNER: WATERWOOD MAINTENANCE

GREETINGS FROM THE MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT, NEIGHBORS.

#### PROGRESS SINCE THE LAST COLUMN:

THE DAMAGE TO THE POOL AREA FROM THE FALLEN HUGE PINE TREE IS ON THE ROAD TO BEING CORRECTED. WE HAVE RECEIVED PAYMENT FROM THE ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNER FOR THE DAMAGES. THE PLAYGROUND CONTRACTOR IS FABRICATING THE NEW SWING SET AND PREPARING ALL THE OTHER PARTS. THIS TAKES TIME. BUT THE CLOCK TOWARD FULL REPAIR HAS STARTED.

WE ALSO UPGRADED THE DRAINAGE FROM THE PLAYGROUND OUTWARDS. CALL THIS PHASE 2 OF THE PLAYGROUND DRAINAGE ISSUES. THE LOOK OF THE PLAYGROUND RETAINING BARRIER JUST OPPOSITE OF THE BATHROOMS IS DIFFERENT. AND THE PLAYGROUND AREA HOLDS MUCH LESS WATER NOW.

THE SPRINKLER SYSTEMS AT BOTH THE 190 ENTRANCE AND THE 980 ENTRANCE HAVE BEEN REFURBISHED. THEY FULLY WORK NOW AND THEY HAVE BEEN MODIFIED SO THAT EXPOSED CONTROL BOXES ARE NOT VISIBLE. WE HOPE THAT THIS WILL DISCOURAGE VANDALISM. WE CAN CONTROL THEM FROM A SMARTPHONE.

THE SPRINKLERS AT THE POOL HAD A MALFUNCTION SEVERAL WEEKS AGO THAT FLOODED THE AREA AND FORCED US TO SHUT OFF THE WATER TO THE ENTIRE POOL AND PAVILION. (WE SHOULD HAVE VIEWED THE FLOODING AS AN OMEN.) THIS HAS BEEN FIXED AND WE ADDED A SPRINKLER ISOLATION VALVE SO THAT IN THE FUTURE. WE CAN LEAVE THE POOL WATER SYSTEM ON (AND THUS HAVE BATHROOM ACCESS) WHILE WE FIX THE SPRINKLERS.

THE DRAINS ALONGSIDE THE POOL PARKING AREA WERE DUG OUT BY ED KILE AND FAMILY FOR THE WNGRA GOLF TOURNAMENT. THEN JETTED CLEAR BY BULLDOG IRRIGATION LAST WEEK. THANK YOU, ED, YOU DA MAN.

WE HAVE OBTAINED A QUOTE FOR PLACING A BARRIER IN A SPECIFIC SPOT IN THE SUBDIVISION WHICH MAY HELP MINIMIZE THE DAMAGE DONE BY CARELESS AND PERHAPS INTENTIONAL FOUR-WHEELERS.

#### FEDERAL DISASTER RESPONSE

THE STORMS THAT ARRIVED EARLY ON APRIL 29TH WERE THE FIRST IN A STRING OF SEVERE WIND AND RAIN EVENTS. BARELY HAVE WE GOTTEN PAST THE EFFECTS FROM ONE STORM WHEN WE SUFFERED THROUGH ANOTHER.

#### KEITH'S CORNER: WATERWOOD MAINTENANCE CONTINUED

THE STORMS AFFECTED WATERWOOD IN SIX AREAS:

- DOWNED TREES, MANY CAUSING TOTAL BLOCKAGE OF VARIOUS STREETS.
- DAMAGE TO SURFACE DRAINAGE AND CULVERTS IN SEVERAL CRITICAL AREAS
- FURTHER DETERIORATION OF ROADS AND PAVING
- SEVERE UPSET OF THE POOL'S CHEMISTRY CAUSED BY REPEAT WAVES OF WATER FILLED WITH SEDIMENT TO FLOW INTO THE POOL ITSELF
- DAMAGE AND FAILURE OF THE POOL AREA'S DRAINAGE SYSTEMS, ACCOMPANIED BY EROSION, AND CAUSING VERY SLIPPERY CONDITIONS ON THE PARKING LOT
- DAMAGE TO RESIDENCES OF VARIOUS

  HOMEOWNERS. I AM ONE OF THOSE.

  HAVING WATER IN MY HOUSE AND

  ARRANGING A ROOF REPAIR PROJECT.

  SOME OF MY TEAM HAD WORSE PROBLEMS.

#### PROBLEMS WITH THE POOL AND PAVILION

I TRY AND DEAL WITH FACTS IN THESE PAGES: THE FOLLOWING IS NOT INTENDED TO DISPARAGE ANYONE. THE FACT IS THAT THE STORMS HAVE EXPOSED SEVERAL FLAWS WITH THE POOL AND PAVILION. MAINLY REGARDING WHAT WE CALL CIVIL ENGINEERING: DRAINAGE, ELEVATION OF THE GROUNDS. AND SIMILAR FACTORS.

THE SIMPLE EXPLANATION IS THAT THE ADJACENT PROPERTY SITS SEVERAL FEET HIGHER THAN DOES THE POOL PROPERTY. WHILE THE POOL AREA SURVIVES NORMAL RAINS WITH NO PROBLEM. IN THESE STORMS WATER FLOWED SIDEWAYS ACROSS THE POOL AREA AND DOWN



TOWARDS THE GULLY BETWEEN THE POOL AND THE FIRE DEPARTMENT. THIS WATER CARRIES DIRT AND MUD WITH IT. RUINING THE POOL CHEMISTRY AND MAKING ALL PAVED AREAS SLIPPERY. THE CONTAMINATED WATER CAUSES ALGAE TO GROW IN THE POOL WATER. AND WHEN ALGAE STARTS IT IS VERY HARD TO STOP. SAFETY IS COMPROMISED BY WATER CHEMISTRY AND SLIP/FALLS.

MAINTENANCE WILL PROVIDE AT LEAST TWO, WORKING ON THREE. COMPETITIVE BIDS FOR CORRECTING THESE ISSUES. AND PRESENT A PLAN TO THE WIA BOARD IN THE NEAR FUTURE. WE HAVE ONE BID IN PROCESS AND ARE WORKING TO GET VENDOR NO. 2 OUT HERE NEXT WEEK. WE'RE LOOKING FOR VENDOR 3 AS WELL.

IN THE MEANTIME, PAT ZAPPA AND TOM READAL ARE PLACING TEMPORARY DRAINAGE BARRIERS ONTO THE POOL DECK. THESE SHOULD HELP US WHILE PERMANENT FIXES ARE BEING PLANNED.

KEITH'S CORNER: WATERWOOD MAINTENANCE CONTINUED

FEDERAL DISASTER PAPERWORK REQUIREMENTS

THE BEST WAY TO DESCRIBE WORKING WITH THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IS THIS: "TO FIX 100 POUNDS' WORTH OF PROBLEM. YOU HAVE TO SUPPLY THEM WITH 1.000 POUNDS' WORTH OF PAPER." ALL OF US WHO WORK FOR YOU. THE RESIDENTS. WE NOT ONLY HAVE TO CUT TREES. WORK TO FIX ROADS AND CULVERTS. AND REPAIR THE POOL FACILITIES. WE ALSO HAVE TO SPEND HUNDREDS OF HOURS MAKING SURE THAT WE DOCUMENT EVERYTHING WE HAVE DONE.

#### I'M PROUD OF THE MAINTENANCE TEAM

FOLKS, LOOK AT THE LIST OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS THAT START OUT THIS ARTICLE. THERE ARE SIX MAJOR IMPROVEMENTS / FIXES LISTED THAT SHOULD IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF LIFE AND THE APPEARANCE OF THE NEIGHBORHOOD. ALL OF THESE WERE COMPLETED IN A MONTH FILLED WITH THREE WEEKS OF PURE DISASTERS. THE MAINTENANCE TEAM NEVER STOPPED WORKING THIS MONTH, NOT FOR A DAY. SOME ON THE TEAM HAD TO DEAL WITH FIXES TO THEIR OWN PLACE ON TOP OF WORKING IN THE COMMUNITY FOR THE LONG TERM AND DEALING WITH THE STORMS, I DID. WITHOUT THEIR DEDICATION ABOVE AND BEYOND. WE'D STILL HAVE STREETS BLOCKED BY TREES AND COLLAPSED FROM BLOWN-OUT CULVERTS. ADDING TO THEIR EFFORTS. THERE WERE

NOTABLE CONTRIBUTIONS FROM RESIDENT VOLUNTEERS ON SPECIFIC DAYS WHEN THESE WERE MUCH NEEDED. PLEASE CONGRATULATE ALL OF THESE FOLKS FOR A JOB WELL DONE:

- PAT ZAPPA. TREE LEADER. ALONG WITH CAROLE MAGEE WHO BACKS HER UP. WE HANDLED AN ESTIMATED 70 TO 80 TREES THIS MONTH AND NEVER LET A STREET BE BLOCKED FOR MORE THAN A COUPLE OF HOURS. THIS INVOLVED MANY EARLY MORNINGS BEFORE THE FIRST CUP OF COFFEE.
- RAY RAMIREZ. PAVING AND ROADS LEADER. ALONG WITH ED KILE AS BACKUP. OUR ROADS ARE IN SEVERE DISTRESS DUE TO FLOWING WATER. WITH RUINED CULVERTS BEING SOME OF THE MAIN CULPRITS. (GET IT. CUL-PRITS?). RAY HANDLED SO MUCH OF THE ORGANIZATION NEEDED TO GET QUICK FIXES ACCOMPLISHED. THESE ARE STILL ONGOING AND MAY BE FOR SOME TIME.
- TOM READAL AND HIS BACKUP, ROB DAVIS. THESE GUYS HAVE BEEN AND STILL ARE FIGHTING THE BATTLE OF CHEMISTRY IN THE POOL WATER. THEY HAVE SUPERVISED THE FULL DRAINING OF THE POOL. MANUAL CLEANING. AND ITS REFILLING. ALONG WITH MANY OTHER STEPS IN TRYING TO GET THE POOL WATER CLEAR AND CLEAN AGAIN.

AS USUAL, FOLKS AROUND HERE HAVE MIXED ATTITUDES TOWARD THE DISASTER RESPONSE EFFORTS. THANKS TO THE PEOPLE WHO TRY TO

UNDERSTAND THE EXTRA LOAD UNDER WHICH THE ENTIRE COMMUNITY HAS BEEN PLACED. THIS IS GREATLY APPRECIATED.

HOWEVER. THERE ARE SOME OF YOU OUT THERE WHO DON'T REALLY SEEM TO GET IT AT ALL. I WAS LITERALLY STANDING OUT IN THE STREET IN THE WIND AND RAIN ONE MORNING WITH A CHAIN SAW IN MY HAND, CUTTING UP A LARGE OAK TREE THAT WAS BLOCKING A PARTICULAR STREET. WHILE OUT THERE. A RESIDENT CAME UP AND ASKED ME TO FIX A PROBLEM HE WAS HAVING WITH HIS NEIGHBOR. SINCE I WAS A WIA PERSON. THIS IN THE MIDDLE OF A FEDERAL DISASTER .... IN THE MIDDLE OF THE STREET....IN THE AFTERMATH OF THE STORM.

PEOPLE ASK WHY IT HAS TAKEN SO LONG TO FIX THE POOL. THEY THINK THAT MAJOR DAMAGE GETS FIXED WITH A MAGIC WAND BY LARGE DEPARTMENTS. MAJOR FIXES TAKE MAJOR TIME. THIS ESPECIALLY HOLDS TRUE WHEN YOU HAVE A LIMITED STAFF AND LIMITED BUDGET. MY STAFF. WHICH DESERVEDLY RECEIVED BIG THANK-YOU'S ABOVE. TOTALS 8 PEOPLE OF WHICH 4 ARE BACKUPS. AND EVERY ONE OF THEM IS A RESIDENT VOLUNTEER. WE'RE DOING ALL THIS WORK WITH VERY FEW PEOPLE AND WE ALL EARN \$ 0.

YOU KNOW, MANY FOLKS OUT HERE HAVE COME FROM THE BIG CITY TO GET AWAY FROM ITS NOISE AND ITS CLUTTER. MANY OF US LOVE THE PEACE THAT WATERWOOD PROVIDES. UNFORTUNATELY, A CERTAIN PERCENTAGE OF FORMER CITY FOLKS SEEM TO WANT IT BOTH WAYS. THEY DON'T REALIZE THAT IN EXCHANGE FOR THE SOFT PACE OF LIFE OUT HERE IN THE COUNTRY, THEY HAVE TO GIVE UP ANOTHER ASPECT OF BIG CITY LIFE: PEOPLE OUT HERE CANNOT CALL "SOMEONE." OR "THEM." OR "THEY" TO COME FIX STUFF ON DEMAND. OUT HERE, "SOMEONE" HAPPENS TO BE "ME." "THEY" HAPPEN TO BE MY SMALL DEDICATED TEAM OF VOLUNTEERS WHO STEPPED UP IN A BIG WAY TO KEEP THIS PLACE RUNNING THIS LAST MONTH. SO INSTEAD OF CALLING UP THE WIA OFFICE AND COMPLAINING ABOUT EVERY LITTLE THING, WHY DON'T YOU GIVE A FEW MINUTES A WEEK AND HELP THINGS OUT AROUND HERE? PUTTING IT BLUNTLY: WE'RE NO ONE'S MINIONS. WE'RE VOLUNTEERS.

A HYPOTHETICAL EXAMPLE: INSTEAD OF TAKING PICTURES OF YOUR CLOGGED STREET DRAINS. UPLOADING THEM. AND TYPING UP AN E-MAIL TO THE WIA OFFICE. HOW ABOUT SIMPLY WALKING OUT THERE WITH A RAKE AND CLEAR THEM YOURSELF IN THE SAME AMOUNT OF TIME? THAT'S WHAT I DO ON MY STREET. JUST SAYIN'...

### **V-Vay June 6th**

HE JUNE 6, 1944, D-DAY INVASION OF NAZI-OCCUPIED FRANCE WAS UNPRECEDENTED IN SCALE AND AUDACITY, USING THE LARGEST-EVER ARMADA OF SHIPS, TROOPS, PLANES AND VEHICLES TO PUNCH A HOLE IN ADOLF HITLER'S DEFENSES IN WESTERN EUROPE AND CHANGE THE COURSE OF WORLD WAR II. WITH VETERANS AND WORLD DIGNITARIES GATHERING IN NORMANDY TO COMMEMORATE THE 80TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE LANDINGS, HERE'S A LOOK AT SOME DETAILS ABOUT HOW THE OPERATION UNFOLDED.

#### WHO TOOK PART?

NEARLY 160,000 ALLIED TROOPS LANDED IN NORMANDY ON JUNE 6, 1944. OF THOSE, 73,000 WERE FROM THE UNITED STATES AND 83,000 FROM BRITAIN AND CANADA. FORCES FROM SEVERAL OTHER COUNTRIES WERE ALSO INVOLVED, INCLUDING FRENCH TROOPS FIGHTING WITH GEN. CHARLES DE GAULLE. THE ALLIES FACED ABOUT 50,000 GERMAN FORCES.

MORE THAN 2 MILLION ALLIED SOLDIERS, SAILORS, PILOTS, MEDICS AND OTHER PEOPLE FROM A DOZEN COUNTRIES WERE INVOLVED IN THE OVERALL OPERATION OVERLORD, THE BATTLE TO WREST WESTERN FRANCE FROM NAZI CONTROL THAT STARTED ON D-DAY. WHERE AND WHEN? THE SEA LANDINGS STARTED AT 6:30 A.M., JUST AFTER DAWN, TARGETING FIVE CODE-NAMED BEACHES: UTAH, OMAHA, GOLD, JUNO, SWORD. THE OPERATION ALSO INCLUDED ACTIONS INLAND, INCLUDING OVERNIGHT PARACHUTE LANDINGS ON STRATEGIC GERMAN SITES AND U.S. ARMY RANGERS SCALING CLIFFS TO TAKE OUT GERMAN GUN POSITIONS.



ABOUT II,000 ALLIED AIRCRAFT, 7,000 SHIPS AND BOATS, AND THOUSANDS OF OTHER VEHICLES WERE INVOLVED.


MANY DEATHS ON ALL SIDES
A TOTAL OF 4,414 ALLIED TROOPS WERE
KILLED ON D-DAY ITSELF, INCLUDING 2,501
AMERICANS. MORE THAN 5,000 WERE
WOUNDED.

IN THE ENSUING BATTLE OF NORMANDY, 73,000 ALLIED FORCES WERE KILLED AND 153,000 WOUNDED. THE BATTLE — AND ESPECIALLY ALLIED BOMBINGS OF FRENCH VILLAGES AND CITIES — KILLED AROUND 20,000 FRENCH CIVILIANS.

THE EXACT GERMAN CASUALTIES AREN'T KNOWN, BUT HISTORIANS ESTIMATE BETWEEN 4,000 AND 9,000 MEN WERE KILLED, WOUNDED OR MISSING DURING THE D-DAY INVASION ALONE. ABOUT 22,000 GERMAN SOLDIERS ARE AMONG THE MANY BURIED AROUND NORMANDY.

Flag Day is a holiday celebrated on June 14 in the United States. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777 by resolution of the Second Continental Congress.
