
2022 Annual Meeting

Do you want to get involved in the community but not ready to make a commitment to run for the Waterwood Board of Directors? Many residents and property owners aren't ready to commit to running for the Board but still want to get involved and make a difference for Waterwood. One way to do this is to join a Waterwood Board committee. Waterwood Board members volunteer for, or are assigned as, committee leads. Several committees would appreciate non-Board members be part of their committee. A few committees that could use assistance are, Maintenance, Social, Bylaws and Covenants, Fire and EMS, Collections and Strategic Planning.

Another committee that Texas state law requires non-Board members' make -up the entirety of the committee is the Architectural Control Board. Changes to the <u>Architectural Review Committees & Appeals – Texas Property Code</u> <u>209.00505</u> effective September 1, 2021, dictated that "Directors [board members], their spouses and other members of their household may no longer serve on architectural review committees (ACC/ARC)". With this change to the statute, Board members were removed from the committee. The current members of this committee are now Kathy Samperi and Lisa Hayman. Additional members are needed as this committee has to cover the entire subdivision. Your help would be greatly appreciated.



Popsicles at the Pool








Stop the Bleed- Free to the public. Max class size is 20 individuals.





The Golden Native Flowers of Waterwood By Maryann Readal

Native flowers are persistent. I like to ponder how our neighborhoods would look if these flowers could keep on growing and spreading their seeds. This article is about some of the beautiful golden native plants that are growing now in Waterwood.



You probably have noticed a short bright yellow flower blooming everywhere now. It is the yellow sneezeweed, *Helenium amarum*. You see this native plant growing even from the cracks in the pavement along the Parkway. Just a short distance up Highway 190 toward Huntsville, you can see fields that are covered with these golden blooms. This plant blooms off and on all summer here in our part of Texas. Native bees, insects, butterflies and beetles—our important pollinators-- are attracted to the flower's nectar and pollen. Carl Linnaeus, the famous botanist and physician (1707-1778) who


organized the plant and animal world, named this plant after Helen of Troy. Legend has it that wherever Helen's tears touched the ground, these golden flowers grew.

Another golden flower you may have noticed along the Parkway is the Rio Grande copperlily, *Habranthus tubispathus*. This very small plant is a bulb in the amaryllis family. It is native to South America, but has naturalized in Texas and in Louisiana. You may see patches of this plant along the edges of Waterwood Parkway. It blooms in the late summer and into fall. It is a low grower and the flowers open at an angle to the leafless stem. You do not see this copperlily growing in many places and it is a mystery how this lily came to grow on our Waterwood Parkway.





Goldenrod, *Solidago* spp., will be blooming soon along the roadsides. There will be a noticeable stand of goldenrod in Waterwood's landscaped bed at Highway 190. This plant has received a bad reputation for being the plant responsible for people's allergies. However, goldenrod pollen is too large to be airborne. The real culprit for seasonal allergies is ragweed which blooms about the same time. Eighty-two species of native butterflies and moths use goldenrod as a host plant, which means that the caterpillars of these insects eat the plant before becoming

butterflies. Goldenrod blooms just in time for the fall migration of monarch butterflies returning to Mexico. Although the monarch is not reproducing at this time of year, it does need the nectar in goldenrod for nourishment on its journey south. And by the way, I spotted a migrating monarch in my yard several weeks ago. An interesting fact about goldenrod is that Thomas Edison experimented with making tires from the latex in goldenrod and convinced Henry Ford to use these "goldenrod" tires on his Model T.

The Waterwood Conservation Committee is a group of concerned residents raising awareness of Waterwood's natural resources and how to preserve them for the continued beauty of Waterwood. We encourage you to look around your neighborhood and when you spot these golden beauties along our Parkway or subdivision roads, we hope you will see them not as weeds but as life-giving food and shelter for native bees, butterflies, birds, and insects and as beauty for all of our eyes to see.




