
The WIA office experienced a huge loss a few weeks ago when the hard drive on one of the computers crashed. Nothing was recoverable and it has caused a few hardships with the office staff. Please be patient while we try to remember and recreate 27 years of information.

Please remember that trailers may only be stored in a garage or carport and must be screened from view of street, golf course and lake. The restriction on all boat and jet ski trailers that was approved by the membership in 2019 allowing those to be parked in your driveway was from May 1 through September 30. WIA has a storage facility for those needing a place to move those trailers. The cost is \$120 per year. Please stop by the WIA office to purchase one.

Every Monday leaf and limb pickup is for leaves and limbs. The maintenance workers take the bagged leaves to the debris area and open each bag to keep in compliance with Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). WIA & MUD joined forces to asphalt 14 sewer tap/road cuts that were spread out throughout Waterwood. This was to reduce cost by combining multiple jobs. I'm sure your vehicles will notice the difference. WIA has also repaired damage to Waterwood Parkway, culvert road surface on White Oak Lane and manhole area in Whispering Pines 2. The leaf & limb debris was cleared out for the third time this year. Numerous dead trees were removed from the easements. Flores Tree service has done a great job clearing obstructions from easements in Greentree and Whispering Pines 2. We also cut and mulched the underbrush at the median by 190.

WIA is modifying the parking area in front of the office. Dirt washes down and collects where people exit their vehicles. We are placing a fifty foot galvanized grate drain to eliminate the problem. This will be happening very soon. I apologize in advance for the short term inconvenience.





<u>Fiber Update</u> Jamie Groskopf

Greentree Village

Work continues in the Greentree Village neighborhood. Conduit and pedestal installation is now over 90% completed. Pedestal to home connections should begin in the coming weeks. Those of you who have signed up in GTV should expect to be contacted soon about the cable run and outside demarcation box installation. This will be the final step before we schedule the service installation inside your home once the main connection is ready. The deadline for Greentree Village free installation offer ends 10/31/2021!! Please signup prior to this date to avoid a \$149 installation fee!!! Signing up is free and there is no obligation. We simply want to know if you are interested prior to building the network.

Whispering Pines – 1

Planning is underway for the installation in WPl and should begin shortly, depending on sub-contractor availability. The deadline for Whispering Pines-1 free installation sign up is 11/30/2021

Why do we have a deadline?

I get asked this often and wanted to explain again. When designing the network distribution it takes a lot of planning prior to the work being completed. Once the network is built and another residence wishes to join we have to go back and add to that plan, take equipment back out to the area and open the network back up to get that signal to the new user. Sometimes this involves a moderate amount of work, sometimes it involves a very large amount of work. For instance, if nobody on your street signs up, we will probably not run a cable down your street. Later, when you wish to sign up and we have already transitioned from construction to operations, we will have to come back and build all that infrastructure to get to your house which may cost many thousands of dollars and days of work. If you do not sign up on the initial pass, you may also have to wait until the rest of Waterwood has been built for us to come back to add your home, which could be over a year away.

Internet Cost

There has been some confusion on the cost. The quoted prices for Internet will be the total amount billed. \$85.00 for 100Mbps or \$125.00 for 1000Mbps (Gigabit) service. No fees, taxes, or other charges are applied unless you request special service add-ons. While this may be more than what your current itemized bill shows for Internet right now, we will not be adding the numerous line-item fees for network improvement, Universal Service Fees, Access Charges, etc. that most large providers use to keep their quoted prices artificially low. In almost all instances we will be a lower total amount than what you currently pay in Waterwood. If you currently take advantage of the Emergency EBB program for pandemic related broadband assistance, please contact us at info@LCSfiber.com with a copy of your current bill to maintain this benefit. If you opt to keep/have a VoIP landline phone with us, there will be state mandated sales tax for that portion of the bill only. We cover the other mandated FCC and 911 fees for you!


The next meeting is Oct. 13, 2021-Blast from the Past you <u>must sign up</u> for this meeting if you plan to attend. We hope to see many of you there.

The most beloved backyard bird

Northern Cardinals are at home in the South

Now that nesting season is over and migrations are underway, you may not be seeing as many songbirds at your feeders. However, the crimson Cardinals are still here in full force, decorating shrubs and fences and gobbling up sunflower seeds when offered.



Cardinals mate for life

Most everyone recognizes this conspicuous songbird with its prominent crest and short, thick bill. The males, slightly smaller than a Robin, are brilliant red all over with a reddish bill and black face. The females look a bit like a faded version of the male, with red accents on the crest and reddish tinges to the wings and tail that brighten their pale brown bodies.

Northern Cardinals are somewhat misnamed. Their territory is most of the eastern half of the U.S., and it stretches from southern Canada into Mexico. Regardless, this flashy member of the finch family is a perennial favorite across the country; it is the state bird of seven states. Cardinals do not migrate, and they don't molt into a dull plumage, so they are breathtaking year-round, making them perfect subjects for winter photos and Christmas cards.

Northern Cardinals are common in inhabited areas such as backyards, parks and shrubby forest edges since the birds like to take cover in dense tangles of shrubs and vines. Cardinals are early risers; their distinctive 'pretty, pretty' whistles are often one of the first sounds of the morning, especially in summer.


Only a few female North American songbirds sing, but the female Northern Cardinal does, often while sitting on her nest, perhaps to tell her mate when to bring food. A mated pair shares song phrases; however, the female's song is longer and slightly more complex than the male's.

Sparring male Cardinals



Cardinals usually mate for life and the pair share responsibility for their young. Like many other bird species, they have elaborate mating rituals that include the male bringing food and feeding it to the female. Male Cardinals are fierce defenders of their territory during breeding season, which lasts from March to September. In addition to attacking intruding males, if he sees his reflection in glass surfaces, he might spend hours fighting the imaginary intruder.

Once paired, the female starts to visit possible nesting sites with the male following along. They will call back and forth and hold nesting material in their beaks as they assess possible sites. Nests are usually wedged into a fork of small branches in dense foliage 1-15 feet off the ground. Over 3 to 9 days, the female builds a nest with the materials the male brings to her. Most Cardinal pairs raise 2 or 3 broods each year. When the female begins to incubate the second brood, the male will care for the previous hatchlings. Owls, eagles, snakes and domestic cats are just some of the predators that pose threats to Cardinal families.

Attracting Northern Cardinals to your yard and feeders is as simple as providing food, places for nesting, and shelter. Northern Cardinals eat mainly seeds and fruit, supplementing these with insects such as beetles, crickets, flies, moths and spiders. They readily come to feeders and especially like sunflower or safflower seeds. They are usually the last birds to feed in the evening and often the first bird you see in the mornings, although, with the drought we experienced for the second half of the summer, they have been a constant presence at my feeders.

Since Cardinals have larger jaw muscles than many other songbirds, they can eat bigger seeds. When selecting plants to attract them, look for some with medium-sized seeds as well as a mixture of seasonality. They will also flock to plants with fruits, especially red fruits. The vivid crimson color of male Cardinals comes from carotenoid pigments, which are found in red fruits. Eating more of these scarlet snacks helps a male form brighter red feathers, which enhances his ability to successfully attract a mate.

When very young, baby cardinals eat soft-bodied insects such as caterpillars, so including butterfly host plants such as dill, fennel, hollyhock, mustard greens and snapdragon in your garden will be a boon to Cardinal parents with hungry mouths to feed.

During colder winter months when insects and seeds are scarce, Cardinals need extra food and backyard feeders help them make it through the cold spells. Since they do not migrate, you can leave your feeders out all year. They do like to perch when they eat, so make sure your feeder has space for them to sit. A table feeder is ideal, or you can get birdseed feeders with perches. Also, leaving undergrowth in your yard or around the edges provides shelter from both inclement weather and predators. I wait until spring to do much of my yard cleanup to give the birds a bit more protection.

Happily, Northern Cardinals are abundant in Waterwood and most of their territory, but on average, around 60% of cardinals survive every year, which sadly means around 40% of all cardinals die every year. So, successfully raising their young is essential to their continued well-being. In addition to their natural predators, Cardinals, like most birds, are the victims of habitat loss from increasingly frequent wildfires; young birds are endangered by spring heat waves; and increased urbanization demolishes bird habitat.

So, please give these beloved birds that spend their entire lives in Waterwood as much support as you can, and they will reward you with beauty and song!

Fun Facts: Cardinals are the subject of a surprising number of superstitions. Here are a few:

Cardinals are a symbol of hope and joy, especially around Christmas.

When a Cardinal lands in your yard, it means an angel is near.

Seeing a Cardinal means a family member or friend is safe.

If you see two Cardinals, you're being called to pay more attention to the world around you and to remember that the world is a magical place, which is full of wonder. (I'm not sure what seeing a half dozen means!)
