



<u>Fiber Update</u> Jamie Groskopf

Initial construction for Greentree Village is almost complete. Pedestals have been strategically placed in Greentree Village in the rear of houses and in necessary connection areas.

Whispering Pines 1 & Whispering Pines 2 will be next, so look for construction in those areas as well.

LCS received the approval from the State of Texas for the crossing at US-190 for October.

Overall, the project is on schedule and budget.

For those that have concerns about the monthly cost, keep in mind that LCS monthly rate is all inclusive. \$85 for 100 Mbps and \$125 for 1000 Mbps will be your total bill for internet. Unlike other internet providers, there are no added taxes or fees.

Several months ago, most of you voted to have fiber installed in Waterwood. That vote did not automatically sign you up for internet and installation.





This summer all residents have made a great contribution to the cleanup of Waterwood. Please keep up the good work and remind all contractors to not throw out trash and respect the speed limits.


Remember to deposit only the items that are allowed in the trash bins, and take the rest to the county dump. Please don't stack debris on the sides of your house.

October -"Socks For Soldiers"- New, above ankle socks for men and women, all sizes--Donation Box in Palmer/Windstream Office.


November-"Sweats For Vets"- New sweatpants/sweatshirts (pullover or zip)---Donation Box in Palmer/ Windstream Office.

Tiny, but mighty cute

Carolina Chickadees visit Waterwood feeders all year *By Ruth Massingill*

The Carolina Chickadee is a favorite birdfeeder visitor, and for good reason. It is impossible to see one of these small birds with its distinctive black cap and bib and not smile with delight. They are inquisitive, acrobatic, and seriously cute. Luckily, they are year-round residents in the southeast, so they might make an appearance at your feeder any time.



Waterwood is perfect for these tiny relatives of the Tufted Titmouse, since Carolina Chickadees are attracted to forested areas or suburban yards with large trees. Males and females sport the same black cap with white cheeks, gray wings and back, and white underpants. In addition to their recognizable appearance, you are likely to hear their fast, high-pitched "chikadeedeedeedee" alarm call if they feel threatened. The more 'dees', the more danger they perceive. Other birds heed their warnings and take cover.


Carolina Chickadees are often confused with Black-capped Chickadees since they look almost identical. However, Carolina Chickadees are the smallest North American chickadee, weighing less than one-half ounce, with a length of about 4.25 inches, not much longer than a hummingbird. In fact, I recently saw a chickadee sipping at my hummingbird feeder.

The Black-capped Chickadee does not occur in Texas, but where their range overlaps with the Carolina Chickadee, cross breeding may take place. It seems the two varieties of the bird do not always know the difference either!

Chickadees, do, however recognize threats from larger birds and do not hesitate to defend their territory. Despite their tiny size, flocks of Carolina Chickadees are known to mob predatory birds, especially smaller owls such as Eastern Screech Owls.

From February through July, pairs of Carolina Chickadees either excavate or find an unused cavity, usually high in a tree. They will also employ nest boxes. The female often uses moss for a nest base, topped with a thick lining of hair and/or plant fibers. She lays 5 to 6 eggs and sleeps in the nest while the male sleeps nearby. He brings her food while she incubates the eggs for up to two weeks. Carolina Chickadees also hide in cavities in the winter during extremely cold weather, where they lower their body temperature and stay in a state of hypothermia for as long as 15 hours at a time.

Winter or summer, Carolina Chickadees appreciate feeding stations that offer a mixture of black oil sunflower and safflower seeds, shelled peanuts and suet. Since they devour insects and spiders year-round, they will also gobble up mealworms in feeders. With their small size and acrobatic abilities, they can use almost every type of bird feeder. Be sure any peanuts you provide stay dry so no mold can form on them. At feeders, Carolina Chickadees typically take a seed and carry it to a branch to eat away from other birds. They also glean insects from foliage and tree bark, often hanging upside down to do so.


Chickadees plan future meals; they hide seeds and other items to eat later. Researchers have found that chickadees cache each food item in a different spot and can remember thousands of hiding places. In the winter, when they need to remember those locations, their brains actually expand. A chickadee amplifies its spatial memory by adding brain cells to the hippocampus. In the spring, when memory is less important, the brain shrinks to its regular size. Not surprisingly, chickadees living in harsher winters have larger brains and better spatial memories than those living in more temperate climates.

Although Carolina Chickadees are common, populations are declining, and there are concerns they may be in danger in the immediate future. Consider putting up a nest box to attract a breeding pair. The box should be in place well before breeding season and should have a guard to prevent predators from raiding eggs and young. You can purchase boxes specifically for Carolina Chickadees or construct one if you are handy. Find out all about Carolina Chickadee nest boxes and download a free birdhouse plan <u>HERE</u>.

Whether you are a veteran birder or just beginning to appreciate Waterwood's feathered treasures, the Carolina Chickadee is sure to delight!

Fun Facts: John James Audubon is said to have named the Carolina Chickadee while he was in South Carolina. A group of chickadees is called **a banditry of chickadees**, referring to the mask-like appearance of the bird.
