### Fiber Optic Voting Results

The WIA Board held an open special meeting March 3, 2021 at the Waterwood office. Jamie Groskopf of LCS Fiber Internet provided information about the project to the Board and attending residents. The Board approved unanimously a motion to proceed with the fiber optic project and to get all Waterwood property owner's approval. In addition, a town hall was held on April 13, 2021 to allow WIA residents to ask questions of the Board and Jamie Groskopf. The town hall was well attended. Ballots were mailed out on March 8, 2021 to all Waterwood property owners.

Voting on the fiber optic network installation ended on March 22, 2021. Votes postmarked on or prior to March 22, 2021 were accepted and counted through the close of business Friday March 26, 2021. The final vote count came to 157 votes in favor with 105 votes against. The fiber project passed and is moving forward. Progress on the project will be discussed at monthly WIA meetings, via articles in the Waterwood Neighborhood Newsletter and on Facebook.



#### **Collection of 2020 Annual HOA Fees**

2020 Annual HOA fees were due by December 31, 2020. HOA fees not paid by the December 31, 2020 due date are considered late and subject to a 10% per annum late charge. Late notices were sent to all delinquent HOA fee property owners in February 2021. As of March 31, 2021 the following table reflects the status of paid and unpaid properties, split between Improved (properties with dwellings) and Unimproved (vacant lots).


During the March 19, 2021 WIA Board meeting, the Board voted unanimously to initiate legal/ foreclosure actions on improved property owners with unpaid HOA fees. Letters dated March 31, 2021 and April 1, 2021 were sent via certified mail to all Improved – Single Family and Improved – Multi Family property owners with unpaid HOA fees. If fees are not paid within 30 days of receipt of the certified letter, the accounts will be turned over to the WIA attorney for collection and/or foreclosure.

The WIA Board also voted unanimously to contract with Collections Unlimited to collect on all unpaid unimproved properties. Any unimproved property HOA fees not collected by Collections Unlimited will be turned over to the WIA attorney for foreclosure.

It should be noted that a great deal of our Executive Director's and Finance/Admin's time is expended to send delinquent notices to property owners that do not pay their HOA fees timely. It also costs a significant amount of money in print and postage costs that takes away from how your WIA dues should be used.

#### **Disaster Preparedness Plan**

In the January 2021, February 2021 and March 2021 Waterwood Neighborhood News editions there were articles on the Waterwood Improvement Association, Inc. Disaster Preparedness Plan. Block Captains are continuing with their final preparations in preparing the resident contact lists. ATV Captains are still a work in progress and efforts are being made to get volunteers who own an ATV to participate. Boat Captain duties have been revised so that responses to pick up residents will be made based on where the evacuation is needed.

A decision has been made by the Waterwood Fire Chief Tim McGrath to conduct the first test of our Disaster Preparedness Plan on April 24 at 9:00 A.M. The test will be conducted from 9:00 A.M. – 11:00 A.M. and will be followed by a short look back meeting at the Pavilion. Anyone who wishes to come to the look back meeting is welcome to attend. The look back meeting will allow us an opportunity to review the test results and determine the improvement areas in the plan.

In order for the plan to be successful we will need as many residents to participate as possible. We wanted to make sure this time and date for this first test is known in advance so that we hopefully will have a successful test.

Sign up for residents and volunteers to be Captains is still available in the WIA office so please take care of this as soon as possible. Once residents have signed up, they will be assigned to a Block Captain and will be contacted for instructions on how to use GroupMe.







#### Aerial insectivores

#### Swallows are returning to Waterwood

One of the true signs of spring is when the swallows return from their winter in South America to raise their young. There are at least eight kinds of birds in the swallow family, but the ones we are most likely to see are Purple Martins and Barn Swallows. Both are insect eating machines, devouring hordes of mosquitoes and other flying pests.

Purple Martins are the largest North American swallows. They once nested in tree cavities, but long ago adopted structures put up by human "Martin landlords." Native Americans hung up empty gourds for

Purple Martins before Europeans arrived. Now, Purple Martins in eastern North America nest almost exclusively in apartment-style houses or plastic gourds designed for them.

Putting up a Purple Martin house is like installing a miniature neighborhood. The dark, glossy-blue males and brown females will peer from the entrances and chirp from the rooftops. The community is both social and vocal; if you host Martins, you will hear birdsong morning and evening.


Also a member of the swallow family, the Barn Swallow is smaller than a Purple Martin, but has a longer and more deeply forked tail, blueish-black back, wings and tail, a cinnamon-colored forehead and throat, and creamy underparts.

The Barn Swallow is the most abundant and widely distributed swallow species in the world. It breeds throughout the Northern Hemisphere and winters in much of the Southern Hemisphere.

This bird is also known as the mud swallow because it builds cupshaped nests made from mud and straw on patios, porches, culverts and bridges. Like the Purple Martin, Barn Swallows once nested in natural cavities, but when settlers began building barns, the swallows moved in.

Although their nesting habits differ, members of the swallow family lead similar lives in most other ways. Swallows may stay on the wing for hours in seemingly effortless flight, traveling far and wide to find swarms of small insects. Researchers have discovered that Barn Swallows and Purple Martins divide up the aerial environment into distinct bands. Barn Swallows may cruise low, sometimes just a few inches above the ground or water, while Purple Martins may soar up to 500 feet to find food.

Neither Purple Martins nor Barn Swallows visit seed or suet feeders, but they may take ground-up eggshells or oyster shells placed on an open platform feeder. Shells should be baked for about 10 minutes in a 350-degree oven and then pulverized.

Unfortunately, swallows are one of the most steeply declining groups of birds in North America, so they need all the human help they can get! There are two species of non-native birds, the European Starling and the House Sparrow, which will nest in Purple Martin housing. Starlings will destroy eggs and kill nestlings. They can even prevent Martins from nesting and often injure or kill adults. Unlike native birds, House Sparrows and European Starlings are not protected. Starlings are larger than Purple Martins, with a stocky body, short tail, and a long yellow beak. Many Martin houses are built with starling-resistant entrance holes (SREH)S. There

is a world of helpful information about all aspects of hosting Martins at the <u>Purple Martin Conservation</u> <u>Association</u> website.


Both Purple Martins and Barn Swallows tend to return to the same sites year after year. I have had both kinds of swallows bless me with their companionship every year for more than 20 years. The Barn Swallows use an artificial nest cup I purchased years ago and mounted under a covered porch. They out-

fit the nest with soft feathers and straw and typically raise two sets of 4 to 5 young, beginning in late February or March.

The Purple Martin "scouts," or adult birds, arrive about the same time as the Barn Swallows, with the subadult birds (fledged the previous year) showing up a month or more later. They like to nest in multi-room houses in the open where they can launch themselves skyward to gobble up insects. This year, European Starlings invaded, so I have changed out my Martin house for one with SREH, but I am worried that the Martins may be driven away.

### Swallows are returning to Waterwood (Cont.)

In some cultures, it's a sign of good luck if swallows select your home for their nests, so I feel honored by their presence. Unfortunately, swallows are one of the most steeply declining groups of birds in North America, so they need all the human help they can get! Here in Waterwood, I find that by late June or mid-July, all the swallows have decamped to begin the long trip back to their winter home in South America. I am left swatting mosquitoes and looking forward to their return the following spring!

**Fun Fact:** Putting up martin houses used to be so common that John James Audubon used them to choose his lodgings for the night. In 1831, he remarked, "Almost every country tavern has a martin box on the upper part of its sign-board; and I have observed that the handsomer the box, the better does the inn generally prove to be." (<u>TheCornellLab</u>)
