Waterwood Municipal Utility District #1

With the beginning of a new year there is a change on the Waterwood M.U.D. board. If you have not heard. Roy Knapp has decided to step down as the President and remain on the board as a Director. Donald Marshall was voted to be the new President. I can only hope that I am able to fill the shoes of Roy's who has led this board brilliantly for the past five years.

Many of you do not know me. I am a private person, preferring to work behind the scene rather than be seen, although if you have driven around Waterwood you probably have seen me. Living in Waterwood now for forty years, this place is home and dear to me. I was here when the county club was in full operations, and stayed here because my late wife and myself felt safe, secluded, and since both of us were teachers, our students could not find us.

What the M.U.D. board affects all of us in Waterwood, not only the residents, but each of the board members as well. One of goals Roy established was for the members to remember we are a fiduciary taxing agency, responsible to the residents. We have made changes during his administration to keep spending down, while assuring the residents safe drinking water and the toilets flush. But with a system that was engineered in the late 1970's, the system is aging and is in need of major upgrading. Our first priority we undertook last year was to upgrade and renew our lift stations. Our waste water system was upgraded 10 years ago, or so, with a new waste water treatment plant, but to get the waste water to the system we need the lift stations. Waterwood M.U.D. uses forced main to get the material to the treatment station, which has its own irregularities. One of those is that our system cannot handle disposable wipes, diapers, or feminine hygiene products, so please do not flush them because they clog the lift station which then has to be pumped out and someone go down into the lift station and clean the pump. This costs the district, depending on the severity, between a thousand dollars to several thousand dollars which could be used for other needed purposes.

We at the board will continue to make decisions that best serve the needs of the community, with regards to water and the waste water system. There will be unforeseen difficulties and we will make sure they are taken care of. If you have a concern, please come and address them to the board at our monthly meetings which are on the third Friday of the month starting at 3 p.m. If you feel uncomfortable coming to the meeting, then address your concerns at the Precision office. If you see me about in Waterwood, feel free to stop and talk, after all, I like you am a resident here and want to ensure Waterwood is a place you too can feel safe, secure, and somewhere you want to live.

Keith's Corner: Waterwood Maintenance

GREETINGS FROM THE MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT, NEIGHBORS.

PROGRESS SINCE THE LAST COLUMN:

The next contract for mowing of the roadways and common areas of Waterwood has been issued to four companies as of November 4th. Having written it myself, I must say that it is a brilliantly conceived and well-written masterpiece. It is also ambitious in that it asks for more mowing frequency (more times per month) than the last contract did. Bids are due on December 8, and an extensive evaluation process will be undertaken.

DEREK GILL, newly-elected Board Director, is going to take on a big chunk of Maintenance. Derek has taken over Facilities as well as ramrodding some organizational changes that we are considering. Such as...

"MAINTENANCE PERSON" position for Waterwood

Derek and I are putting out the call for any person (or small company) to express interest in becoming a compensated maintenance person or company for Waterwood. Such a position has been discussed for years, and the time may be now to make this a reality. There are many reasons for this. I won't go into all of them now, the column would be too long. But it is sufficient to say that there are many things out here that either take too long to correct, or go uncorrected at all, due to the lack of volunteer manpower among Board members and the general public. Maybe it's time that we try hiring_aqualified_individual_or_small_company to do a wide range of maintenance-related activities for a reasonable amount of compensation.

KEITH'S CORNER: WATERWOOD MAINTENANCE CONTINUED

Tasks involved range from landscape-type activities to roads maintenance to DIY-level repairs (or better) on anything in the WIA universe that needs fixing. Having your own tools and even some equipment is a requirement. You must be trustworthy and self-motivated; otherwise our relationship won't last long.

Ideally, we'd like a 40-hour per week person or company, but we are very flexible about how a paid arrangement would look. Part time is an option as well, but we think we can fill up your plate all year long.

If you think you'd like to be an all-around handyman for the community, please contact either myself or Derek Gill through the WIA office. We are trying to find the right fit for this opening by January 2025, so don't dawdle, let us know ASAP!

Federal Disaster Response

The SBA application has been withdrawn at the last minute. WIA will explore the long-term repairs to the pool and pavilion by other means. This is Keith talking now, not the Board, but something mysterious happened in the SBA within the last 6 weeks that changed their attitude toward this loan application, perhaps toward all their outstanding loan applications. WIA was needing only one more step to have the loan granted; this step was for WIA to provide collateral for the loan. WIA gave the SBA several options, all of them very common and usual practice, for collateral. All of a sudden, the SBA got very picky about this, to the point of being unreasonable. This change in attitude came from higher-ups within SBA. As a result of this, WIA told the SBA "No Thanks."

KEITH'S CORNER: WATERWOOD MAINTENANCE CONTINUED

The good news in all this is that the costs to repair the pool grounds can easily be borne by WIA. From the beginning of the SBA journey, the loan was considered a proposition that was financially a "toss-up" compared to doing it ourselves. I'll leave it to all of you to speculate just why the SBA got difficult to deal with so quickly. I have my suspicions.

The county-led application for FEMA funds is in place as well. I am working with Precinct 4 and the county coordinator on all of this, still. Progress is slow. FEMA still awaits funding [e.g., they are out of money] due to its funds being used for, uh, other purposes during 2024.

ESD 2 (Emergency Services District Number 2)

The vote on whether or not to create ESD2 has been counted and accepted by the county. There WILL BE an ESD number 2. Several members of the Board, including Jamie Groskopf and Rick Harlow, are working on the next steps for the creation of ESD2 as you read this. Congratulations to the people of Waterwood on what we hope will be a wise decision!

Roadside TREE TRIMMING Delayed

Last month's newsletter said, "We will be trimming trees along various road rights-of-way in November if things go according to Plan." Things did not go according to Plan. We have a legal issue we're working on; tree trimming will be discussed in the next Board Meeting. The general areas to be worked include residential portions of La Jolla / CC3, Augusta / Mauna Kea, Doral, side streets of Bay Hill, side streets of Pebble Beach, and Country Club Drive near Fairway One.


