Greetings from the maintenance department, neighbors.

Progress since the last column:

The Maintenance Committee has been totally reorganized for the second time in two years. In each year it has taken a big jump upward in productivity and skill level compared to my first year. There are many people involved in this improvement. Let's meet them. The latest roster of Maintenance includes:

- o Ray Ramirez in dual role as Roads/Paving and Paid Maintenance person.
- o Sam Butler on Facilities and unofficial advisor to maintenance
- o Pat Zappa as inspector for the mowing contract and coordinator for Leaf and Limb.
- o Tom Readal has stepped down as the Pool Man as of March 21st. Tom's work at the pool reflected true commitment and care for the facility. Tom was the prime mover behind the construction of the Pool and Pavilion. This is why he did such a good job taking care of them; for him it was a labor of love. When you see him please thank him for years of commitment.
- o In Tom's absence we are looking for any person or company willing to handle this job on an ongoing basis. This effort is the highest priority in Maintenance at the moment.
- o Dianne Chrestopoulos as Entrances Coordinator. We expect she will work with Chase's Lawn Care to greatly improve the look of the two formal Waterwood Entrances at 190 and 980.
- o Last but not least, Derek Gill as backup for all things maintenance, Facilities guy, and the man who will take over when I drop off the Board eventually. Derek led the charge to find our paid maintenance person and is a key part of the team.
- o And me, aw shucks, I'm just a humble maintenance guy.

My thanks go to each of these folks. They care about what they are doing and have given Waterwood their best efforts on a consistent basis.

"MAINTENANCE PERSON" position for Waterwood

Derek and I are pleased to announce that RAYMOND RAMIREZ has been hired to perform this work. Those of you who have gone to the Garbage Area lately may have noticed that it is being policed on a regular basis. This is the result of Ray's work. The Mardi Gras celebration at the Pavilion was a bit brighter this year due to the improved appearance of the storm-damaged Pavilion. Ray has done a lot of work on the facility in several areas. The Pool and Pavilion is receiving constant care again and is looking better every week. Not only is Ray doing great work, but he is a source of good ideas for effectively improving the community; I've heard several of them already.

Federal Disaster Response While we are closer to the resolution of this matter, there has been no fundamental change since last month's column, so I am repeating this news in its entirety.

Keith's Corner-Waterwood Maintenance

We have been notified by San Jacinto County that FEMA has "approved our claim for reimbursement" for the money spent repairing many culverts after the May 2024 storms. This is very good news, and it is gratifying after so much work was done to obtain this. I must thank Lisa and Melissa, and especially Ray Ramirez, who spent literally hundreds of hours with me reviewing all of the invoices and paperwork to make sure that we told FEMA an accurate story of how the repairs were done. We are grateful to A and L Paving, the company was there for us when we really needed them and did a great job.

The last hurdles will be for us to:

- Monitor San Jacinto County to assure that we receive whatever the amount FEMA recommends.
- At this time we only have a verbal statement that approval has been obtained.
- FEMA has told us that there might be an 'after payment audit" of our paperwork. If they have a problem with this, they tell us that we might have to give some of the money back. (I'm not making this up; you gotta love our Federal Government!) Luckily Raymond and I have worked hard to internally audit all the records generated by this work, and have reviewed it all once again.

LEAF and LIMB PICKUP

LEAF AND LIMB PICKUP is planned for the FIRST and THIRD MONDAYS of each month. NOTE that the FIRST AND THIRD MONDAYS IN MARCH are MAR 3rd and MAR 17th. The first Monday in April is the 7th.

MOWING CONTRACT for Board Approval at February Board Meeting (2/17/25)

After a lengthy discussion and input from several residents, the current structure of the Mowing Contract was approved by the Board in its 2/17 meeting.

SJC PCT 4 is Planning the fix for the "Inbound Dip" in Waterwood Parkway

Roughly halfway between 190 and the "Welcome to Waterwood" sign on the Parkway, there is a barricade on the side of the road that indicates a severe dip in one lane. This "dip" has been sinking and growing for a while. It effectively forces traffic into one lane only for passage. During a recent talk I had with Mark Nettuno, he informed me that this is in the Precinct 4 Plan to be fixed "soon." The Dip is in fact a collapsing culvert, a big one of 48 inches diameter. Please note that whenever this work starts, the PARKWAY WILL BE SHUT DOWN IN BOTH DIRECTIONS. Look in the customary places - the E-sign by the Office and on Facebook – for warnings about the work. Expected timing for work completion is around 3 days, weather cooperation assumed.

HOW IS A MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT DIFFERENT FROM A HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION?

In some ways, a MUD might appear similar to a homeowners association (HOA). Both a MUD and an HOA have authority over defined areas. Both collect payments from homeowners to cover the costs of the services they provide. That's where the similarities end.

An HOA is a private organization whose authority comes from contracts and restrictive covenants. A MUD is a government entity with the power to levy taxes. While HOAs may have the authority to foreclose on homeowners who fail to pay HOA dues and assessments, MUDs rely on county governments to collect taxes and enforce delinquencies. MUDs are subject to laws like the Open Meetings Act and the Texas Elections Code






Deed Restriction Enforcement Committee

.MMarch 2025 Deed Enforcement Committee Newsletter Report

The deed enforcement committee welcomes volunteers. Currently we have 7 volunteers for our monthly deed drives. February was a very good month as there were no new violations, and several previous violations were cured.

There has been some confusion about trailer/boat storage. Since the trailer storage area is being cleaned up and is closed, the DEC will not be writing any violations for trailers or boats stored on your property until the trailer/boat storage area is opened again. Hopefully this clears up any misunderstanding.

Remember that if you are doing any exterior construction-you need to get an Architectural Control Committee (ACC) Large or Small Improvement Application/Additional Improvement Application available on the website waterwoodwia.org under documents or at the WIA office. Then you need to submit the application and get ACC approval before you can start construction.

Additionally we are starting to check for damaged fences, leaning or needing repair. Should your fence need repair or replacement, please remedy by fixing or removing your fence before we have to send you a deed restriction violation letter. If you are repairing or replacing your fence with the same type of material, you do not need an ACC Small improvement Application/Additional Improvement Application. However, if you are changing from the original design and material then a Small Improvement Application/Additional Improvement Application is necessary.

We are getting complaints of dogs running loose and unattended, pooping and peeing in neighbors' yards, chasing people and pets. It is a violation of the protective covenants of all subdivisions and carries a fine of \$250. San Jacinto County has a leash law as well. So please keep your dogs confined in your yard and on a leash when they are not in your yard.

Mowing season is here, so let's all work on keeping our yards cleaned up and mowed to keep your Waterwood neighborhood looking good. March means Spring and Spring means cleaning.

Waterwood Post Office Box Fees Due

The 2025 Post Office Box fees are due. The maintenance fee is still \$40 per year with keys costing \$10 for up to 2 keys (subject to change due to increasing prices of keys), and \$20 each for replacements. Fees may be paid in cash in the office or by check or money order, made out to "PMC". You may also pay by PayPal by contacting me directly by texting 936-661-7767.
